### Expressive Arts

### Maths and Numeracy

Use a table to record how many pieces of plastic you find in different areas of your home recycling (e.g., bottles, tubs, wrappers), then add the totals and identify which type appears the most.



### Language, Literacy and Communication

Write a short paragraph imagining you are an explorer discovering a new underwater world of the future.



### Health and Wellbeing

Create a mini "ocean wellbeing plan" listing three habits that help keep both people and the oceans healthy (e.g., choosing reusable bottles, spending time outdoors, eating sustainably).



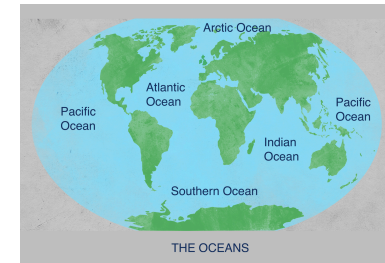
### Science and Technology

### Humanities
